A Challenging Time for Thailand



A highlight of the year was on the first of November when we celebrated Voice of Peace 48th anniversary by arranging a seminar on Christian leadership. We were blessed by the support of many friends, and more than 230 Christian leaders participated in the event. The speaker, Rev. Dr. Joseph Tong, was well received as he shared about evangelism in Asian contexts. The special book **"Testimonies of Christian Leaders"** was distributed to all participants and to brothers and sisters in Christ all over the country, giving them new spiritual inspiration as they read the life stories of key people.

Another highlight was the attendance at the EMDC conference, which was conducted in Chiang Mai, and Dr. Jariya Sornmayura and Dr. Viggo Søgaard were plenary speakers. Several participants came to visit Voice of Peace, and this has given us many new contacts. New partners have provided encouragement and excitement.

Highlights of the year were also the start of two new exciting projects, which will be further explained in this report. The so-called Proverbs Project seeks to communicate the message of Jesus to modern, educated Thai Buddhists. At the same time, the MegaVoice project will communicate the basics of the Bible message to many different ethnic groups in the mountains in both Thailand and Myanmar. Through everything we do, we want to communicate the message of Jesus: *My Peace I give you*.

A Unique tool for teaching those who have difficulties in reading



MegaVoice is producing a special player for use among ethnic groups, where only a minority are functionally literate. The model used is the Storyteller that can have app. 8 hours of sound recording. The purpose is evangelism and Bible teaching, but there are also social needs and other needs that can be covered. At a special micro-finance based project in Burma, the Storyteller is used for training village people. Apart from the micro-finance project itself, there is also teaching on sanitation, trafficking, violence against women, etc. A special branch will bring Bible and evangelistic material.

The Mega Voice is charged by the sun, so it does not require batteries. The size of the Storyteller player is like a cell phone. The sound is loud enough for a small group to listen together. Voice of Peace is planning to produce the Bible material in several different languages.

Refugees Preparing for Ministry

At the Mae La refugee camp, which is situated close to the Burma border, an exciting community exists under the leadership of Rev. Dr. Simon. Voice of Peace has been involved in a variety of ways, helping to provide resources, give teaching, and promote the ministry of the Bible College, including an orphanage with more than 200 children and a home for handicapped who have been blinded and maimed by landmines.

Radio Broadcasting to the whole Country and Beyond

Voice of Peace has throughout 2013 been broadcasting on 13 government radio stations, and 56 local stations have used the programs regularly. For Christmas, another 36 stations broadcast VOP programs. VOP own local radio is broadcasting everyday from 8.00 to 22.00 and there are two Internet based channels that can be heard around the world.

Prisoners are Believing in Jesus.

Fifteen years ago, a prisoner by the name of Somwang gave his life to Jesus. He then lead many other prisoners to study the Bible by correspondence from Voice of Peace. Somwang was later pardoned, and he then continued to minister to the prisoners. And when the Christians are released, he assists them and introduces them to local churches. Support for this ministry is received from Christians in Denmark. During these 15 years, more than 5,000 persons have studied the Bible by correspondence, and several hundreds have been baptized. Each year Voice of Peace arranges a special Christmas celebration, as well as participating in several services during the year.
