# **Facilities and Staff**

The Media Centre in Chiang Mai consists of a three storeys building with radio and TV studios, production rooms, administratio offices, follow-up and conference facilities, bookstore and others.



Apart from these, there is a special radio studio operated by the Voice of Peace's staff which broadcasts the programs on a local radio station for people in Chiang Mai areas.

#### **SHARING FACILITIES**

Voice of Peace allows local churches and Christian organizations to use its facilities to produce some good and professional materials.



#### **STAFF**

The director of Voice of Peace, Dr. Jariya, is leading 10 –12 full time staff members and some part time staff members.

#### **MORNING WORSHIP**

Three times a week the staff get together for morning worship, where they sing praise and worship songs, read the Bible and share their personal experiences with God. The worship always ends with prayers for the programs listeners, new believers and family members.

**BOARD OF DIRECTORS** The Voice of Peace is governed by its Board of Directors. The board consists of seven members, mainly Thai. The members have 3-4 meetings a year.

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#### **PRODUCTIONS**

#### **PROVERBS**

'Better a dry crust with peace than a house full of feasting with strife.

Since 2017 Voice of Peace has started its largest project: The Proverbs project. The basis for this is founded in the Thai culture, where proverbs and short expressions often make a foundation for education of new generations.

52 programs have been produced for TV and in a form of DVD, and the same number have been produced for radio and YouTube. At the end they will be printed material.


#### **RADIO PROGRAMS**

Voice of Peace programs are usually broadcasted in a 30 min. slot per day on the local radio stations all over Thailand. The programs have varied focuses during the week: Health, Evangelization, Bible teaching, Basic steps of Christianity and Voice of Wisdom. The radio programs are available on CD and can be bought by either churches or for personal use.





Voice of Peace produces 15 - 20 program scripts every week.



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#### FINGER PUPPETS - FROM GUATEMALA

The program series where finger puppets tell Bible stories have been a hit in many churches. This production for children has originally been produced in Guatemala. Voice of Peace has obtained the rights from the Christian organization, Vina to apply Thai soundtracks to them.

# **SEMINARS**

Like in other places in the world, people in Christian ministries in Thailand also need to be strongthened in their service for God.

There are always questions such as, "How can we build churches in Thailand and how can we talk about Jesus in Thai Buddhism culture?" "Where can we find the obvious open doors?"

"How can we help each other to move from one lifestyle filled with Buddhism idols and practices to a healthy Christian discipleship?"

With realization of a need for the answers to the questions, in February, Dr. Jariya organized a conference: Discipleship and Media for Christian leaders and ministers.

# Seminar with a cooperation of OMF



In September, VOP and Orient Mission Fellowship (OMF)co-organized a seminar: Walk thru the Bible at the VOP Media Centre. Dr. Larry Dinkins was the speaker for this seminar.



#### PRINTED MEDIA

Research shows the efficiency of combining the audio-visual media with the printed media and Voice of Peace is aware of this. Therefore, along with the Proverbs project, which is the audio-visual media, VOP will produce printed booklets on the same topics.

Books and booklets with testimonies from Christians have, in large numbers, been printed and distributed to people during the past years.

Publications such as Power of Prayer and Prayer Calendar has also been produced and distributed.

The printed media can be read and re-read while the digital ones cannot be. This means printed media still have roles which cannot be substituted by the digital media to play.

# **BOOKSHOP**

Voice of Peace has every day visitors who look for book, CD with music or teaching, DVD or other kinds of material. VOP bookshop has variety of products they can choose from.



# **CD PRODUCTIONS**

In 2016, Voice of Peace had several CD productions. *Breath of Faith* was a collection of songs written and sung by prisoners in Udon Thani Central Prison.

*Drink from Their Own Wells* was a DVD produced by the refugees in Mae Lae refugee camp.

Voice of Peace produced a special CD to celebrate Easter. The CD consisted of 10 songs and the Easter message from the Bible.

#### PRODUCTIONS FOR GENERAL INTEREST

Voice of Peace also had products for general Thai people:

- A CD with 6 lectures of King Bhumibhol on Sufficiency Economy, Natural Resources, Ethics, A good life, Good leadership and Education.
- A CD of 10 songs written by King Bhumibhol. The CD will be completed in October, 2018. More information about this is in this report.

# THE KING AND HIS SONGS

The beloved Thai King, King BhumiBol Adulyadej or King Rama IX, was gifted with many talents. Among them were his talents as a songwriter, musician and poet.

Voice of Peace had an aspiration to produce a CD of some of these magnificent songs. As the royal permission for the production was needed, the production process took time as well as many trips for Dr. Jariya to travel from Chiang Mai to the Royal office in Bangkok. Eventually, Voice of Peace was granted the permission to produce 3,000 CDs. The CDs are not religious, but through them, Voice of Peace expected to reach many more Thai people who love music and the King.





# **MESSENGER - MEGAVOICE**

Through decades the audio players have developed at a fast speed. We were all excited, when Dr. Viggo Søgaard introduced the first cassette player which worked without electricity but manually to us.

Few years ago, the audio player Mega-Voice was introduced to us. It was, at that time, a new invention driven only by solar energy and could work for many hours after being charged with solar power.

The Messengers also include additional features to help in emergencies; such as an FM radio & flashlight. Also included is an additional Micro SD slot where people can add additional audio sermons or music from a computer or electronic device which enables the audio library to be enlarged.

These two kinds of solar driven audio player are very much applicable the for Voice of Peace ministry. The messages such as, Bible teaching for illiterate groups, teaching on ethical principles, songs and music, etc. Can be recorded according to the distributors' preferences and specifications.

# SPECIAL OUTREACH

Voice of Peace always looks for special occasions to spread the Good News.

The staff continually produce special programs for days like Valentine's Day, Mother's Day and special Thai national holidays.

Christian celebration of Christmas, Easter and Pentecostal are also very important occasions.









Whenever large events take place in Bangkok, staff members go and be part of them to distribute CDs, DVDs and booklets.

One of those occasions was a gathering to honor King Bhumibhol. Others were visits to churches, universities and a Catholic convent.

#### Voice of Peace is also a blessing for many Christians

Although the goal of Voice of Peace is to reach Thai people who do not know God as their Father or Jesus Christ as their Lord, it is evident from the responses we have received, that many Christians also listen to the programs and are encouraged to tell friends and families about the messages they receive from the programs. Many churches receive materials from Voice of Peace and use them for their evangelistic purposes.



May-Jitsupa Taetua is responsible for the follow up and Bible Correspondence Department. She responses to the listener's letters approximately 50 letters daily.

#### **NOT JUST RADIO LISTENERS**

As Voice of Peace does not only aim to have many listeners, one of the busiest departments at our office is the follow-up department which deals with an average of 50 inquiries a day. These enquiries are sent via Facebook, e-mails, phone calls as well as from walk-in visitors and are answered by a Bible correspondence course.

# **VISITS TO CHURCHES**

Every Thursday evening staff members from Voice of Peace make an appointment with local churches and visit their pastors and church leaders to provide Voice of Peace's materials and products.

The church visit team always receives positive feedbacks on how VOP can help them in their teaching and outreach.

# RADIO STATIONS ACROSS THE COUNTRY

The digital media has, in many ways, been an important factor in spreading the Voice of Peace programs in Thailand.

135 local radio stations are now licensed to download the programs. In addition to that, 18 large stations, include 8 stations operated by the government are currently broadcasting the programs.

One of the stations in Bangkok covers the area of 50 provinces and can be reached by 10 million people.

Voice of Peace is presently paying for air time on some of the largest radio stations. The budget for this is 610.000 Baht (aprox 19.000 USD) which is 10% of the total budget.

#### LOCAL RADIO STATION IN CHIANG MAI

Some years ago, Voice of Peace established a local radio station and is now broadcasting programs for approximately 1 million Chiang Mai people.

A local radio station is operating under the current Government's law and regulations. These regulations change from time to time for the benefits of listeners , recently the programs with focus on people with disabilities were suggested.

One of the goals for this local radio station is to build close relationship with churches, institutions, schools, politicians and other sectors and groups of people in Chiang Mai.
