“Christ’s love expressed through compassionate action.”



The Hope Changes Life Project is a holistic outreach initiative aimed at meeting both spiritual and practical needs. In 2024, this project demonstrates God’s love through tangible acts of compassion.

The “Hope Changes Life” project is a blessed initiative for Thais, especially for non-believers who rely solely on their own guidance. The messages of hope in God, shared by believers and church leaders, have the power to inspire and bring hope to these individuals, ultimately transforming their lives from being hopeless to hopeful and granting them peace of mind.

The Approach: Romans 15:13 speaks of hope: “May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in Him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit” (NIV). The “Hope Changes Life” project, utilizing a multimedia approach, will be a powerful tool to bring hope to the hopeless and disadvantaged. The project focuses on both traditional and modern media platforms.

Media Ministry

Radio Ministry

“Radio remains the heart of VOP’s ministry, reaching listeners daily with God’s Word.”

Radio Ministry remained the cornerstone of VOP’s outreach in 2024. Through consistent daily and weekly programs, thousands of listeners were reached with biblical teaching, prayer, encouragement, and practical life guidance. Radio continued to be a lifeline for rural communities, the elderly, and those without regular access to churches. Listener feedback consistently reflected spiritual growth, renewed faith, and emotional healing through these broadcasts.

In 2024, VOP produced and broadcast a wide variety of programs that addressed spiritual, emotional, and practical needs. There are 10 programs to be broadcasted over more than 150 radio stations. This year, VOP produced the “Hope Changes Life” radio program which has 52 episodes per year.

Program Content: Biblical teaching and preaching, Daily devotionals and prayer programs, Testimonies of transformed lives, Programs addressing family life, health, and moral values, Special programs for children and disabled people.

Ministry Impact: The programs reached listeners in urban and rural areas, provided spiritual support for listeners, received consistent feedback through letters, phone calls, social media, and prayer requests.

Video Ministry

“Creative media allows the Gospel to reach the next generation.”

In response to changing media trends, VOP expanded its video ministry to communicate biblical messages in visually engaging formats. Short video clips were produced to encourage faith, share testimonies, and highlight ministry activities.

Types of Videos: - Short devotional messages - Listener and Church member testimonies, Ministry updates and event highlights, Bible reflections and encouragement

Distribution Channels: Facebook, YouTube, Tik Tok, Other digital platforms.

Printed Media Ministry

“Printed resources bring God’s Word to places digital media cannot reach.”

Printed media continues to play a vital role, especially among elderly listeners, prisoners, and communities with limited digital access. In 2024, VOP produced and distributed various printed resources to support discipleship and spiritual growth.

Materials Produced: Devotional booklets, Christian tracts and teaching materials, Ministry newsletters and prayer calendar monthly. These materials were distributed through churches, prisons, outreach visits, and mail correspondence, not only enabling recipients to grow deeper in God’s Word, but also convincing the non-believers to know more about God’s words and story of Christ.



“Share the Peace Forward Project” is to deliver the message of God’s peace through media in the format of “Printed media and online media. The response from readers has been great. They say it is very encouraging, especially the ending section which has a Bible verse that goes along with the message.

“I have read the message that you posted on your FB every day. I love it very much because it is short and understandable. I sometimes do not have time to read Bible but I can read the message of peace instead. I also use the message for my devotional time. It is very helpful for my spiritual growth. May God bless the VOP team.”



Social Media Ministry

“Social media connects VOP with listeners every day.”

Social media platforms served as important tools for daily encouragement and interaction with audiences. In 2024, VOP maintained a consistent online presence to share God’s Word and ministry updates.

Key Activities: Daily Scripture verses and reflections, Program schedules for prayer requests, daily various radio programs in the format of audio, Live online streaming to promote VOP ministry, Photos and stories from outreach activities

Outcome: Social media helped expand VOP’s reach, foster two-way communication, and build a sense of spiritual community among followers.

Outreach Ministries

Prison Ministry

“Hope and new life in Christ reach even behind prison walls.”

The Prison Ministry of Voice of Peace in 2024 was fruitful and impactful. Many prisoners accepted Jesus Christ as their Savior and faithfully studied Bible lessons provided by VOP. Ongoing correspondence through letters reflected spiritual growth, gratitude, and a strong desire to follow Christ.

The ministry served **four prisons**: Udon Thani, Nong Khai, Lampang, and Klong Pai. Access to **Udon Thani Central Prison** was limited due to prison policies, resulting in fewer visits. **Nong Khai and Lampang Prisons**, being smaller facilities, allowed regular visits as usual. **Klong Pai Central Prison** is located far from the VOP office, and travel distance and costs remain a challenge.



Despite these limitations, the ministry continued effectively through visits, Bible lessons, and follow-up by correspondence. This was made possible through good planning and clear direction under the leadership of **Dr. Jariya Sornmayura, VOP Director**, whose vision and ministry strategy strengthened the effectiveness of the prison outreach. VOP also expresses sincere appreciation to **Pastor Wutthinan Puritang** for faithfully overseeing the ministry in Udon Thani and Nong Khai, and heartfelt thanks to **Rev. Peter Goetz** for his dedicated fund-raising efforts that helped sustain and expand this vital ministry. Above all, VOP gives thanks to God that His Word continues to bring hope and transformation to lives behind prison walls.



Church and Community Visits

“Strengthening faith through partnership with churches and communities.”

Throughout 2024, Voice of Peace continued its commitment to strengthening relationships with churches and local communities through regular visits and ministry engagement. These visits played an important role in encouraging believers, sharing the vision of VOP, and expanding the impact of Christian media ministry.

VOP representatives visited churches and community groups in various locations to share God’s Word, give encouragement, and provide spiritual support. The team also introduced VOP’s radio programs, media resources, and outreach projects, helping churches and community members better understand how media ministry can be used to spread the Gospel and build faith.



In addition to ministry sharing, these visits created opportunities for prayer, fellowship, and mutual encouragement. Many churches and community leaders expressed appreciation for VOP’s ministry and showed interest in ongoing partnership through prayer, volunteer support, and resource sharing.

Church and community visits in 2024 also helped VOP listen directly to the needs of believers and local communities. Feedback received during these visits contributed to improved program content, more relevant Bible teaching, and stronger engagement with audiences.

Overall, the Church and Community Visits in 2024 strengthened unity within the body of Christ, deepened partnerships, and expanded awareness of VOP’s mission. VOP gives thanks to God for every open door, warm welcome, and opportunity to serve, and looks forward to continued cooperation with churches and communities in the future.



Conferences and Meetings

“Equipping staff - leaders and strengthening partnerships for greater impact.”

In 2024, Voice of Peace actively participated in conferences and meetings with churches, Christian organizations, and secular institutions. These engagements were important for strengthening partnerships, encouraging unity in ministry, and enhancing professional standards in radio broadcasting.

VOP joined conferences, seminars, and meetings with churches and Christian networks to share the vision of media ministry, provide encouragement, exchange experiences, and promote cooperation in spreading the Gospel through radio and digital platforms. These gatherings fostered fellowship, prayer, and strategic discussions on effective Christian communication.

In addition, VOP participated in conferences and meetings with secular organizations, particularly those related to radio broadcasting under the supervision of the National Broadcasting and Telecommunications Commission (NBTC). These meetings focused on radio station operations, licensing, broadcasting policies, technical standards, and regulatory compliance, helping ensure that VOP’s radio ministry operates responsibly and in accordance with national regulations.

Voice of Listeners & Audiences & Learners

“Lives transformed through the Voice of Peace.”



In 2024, Voice of Peace (VOP) continued to touch lives through radio, video, and Bible lesson ministries, reflecting God’s love and truth across multiple platforms. Together, these voices affirm that VOP is a trusted companion bringing peace, hope, and the Good News to hearts.

Radio listeners shared heartfelt testimonies of encouragement, comfort, and renewed hope. Many found strength during times of loneliness, illness, family struggles, and imprisonment, while some came to know Christ through consistent listening to VOP programs.

“I listen to your radio program for more than 10 years. I like it very much because it helps me for my spiritual growth. I like the Christian songs that you put in the program. Please send me any Christian books so that I can read and spend time with the word of God.” (Ms. Suchada S. from Buengkan Province)



Video audiences engaged with biblical teachings, testimonies, and encouragement through digital platforms. Viewers testified that the content strengthened their faith, supported daily Christian living, and enabled them to easily share the message of hope with others, especially among younger and online communities.

“I was once a Buddhist and later came to know Christ. However, my husband did not allow me to believe in Jesus. I returned to Buddhism. My life became unstable, and my son also faced many problems. As time passed, my husband passed away, and I was diagnosed with sickness. I watched a short video clip from Voice of Peace, which encouraged me greatly to trust in God. God has almost completely healed me. I thank God and thank VOP for the encouraging videos.” (Ms. Chongrak S., Bangkok)



Bible lesson learners including prisoners and new believers, faithfully studied God’s Word through correspondence courses and Messenger audio players. Many responded with letters expressing spiritual growth, life transformation, and decisions to follow Christ.

“Thank God for Voice of Peace, which sent me Bible lessons through the mail to help me learn the truth about the Lord. My life has faced many obstacles, and many times I felt discouraged, tired, and hopeless. When I came to prison, friends invited me to join worship, sing songs, listen to testimonies, and hear various teachings. As I attended more often, my faith grew, and I welcomed Christ into my life. I have hope in the Lord. (A Prisoner)

Key Christian celebrations such as **Easter** and **Christmas** were observed through special radio programs, online content, and outreach activities that proclaimed the message of Christ’s resurrection and the hope of salvation. VOP also marked important social occasions, including **Mother’s Day** and **Children’s Day**, by producing dedicated programs and activities that honored families, encouraged Christian values, and brought joy and encouragement to audiences of all ages.



A significant milestone in 2024 was the celebration of the **12th year of service of the Director, Dr. Jariya Sornmayura** recognizing God’s faithfulness, leadership, and commitment in guiding the ministry. This occasion became a time of thanksgiving, reflection, and renewed dedication to the vision of Voice of Peace.

The flood caused significant damage to floors, doors, studio spaces, and broadcasting equipment, disrupting normal operations. Despite the losses, the VOP team remained resilient, trusting God’s provision and continuing the mission with faith, perseverance, and hope during this challenging time.



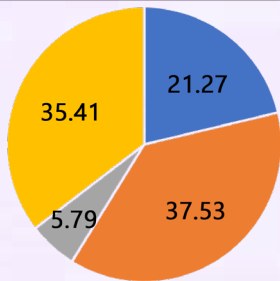
Financial Summary – 2024

“God’s faithful provision enabled us to steward His resources wisely.”

In 2024, Voice of Peace (VOP) was blessed with total income of **3,663,020.48 Baht** (\$106,918.29) exceeding total expenses of **3,489,827.13 Baht** (\$101,863.02). As a result, VOP achieved a positive financial balance of **173,193.35 Baht** for the year. This good outcome reflects God’s provision, faithful stewardship, and the generous support of donors, enabling the ministry to continue its mission with stability and gratitude.

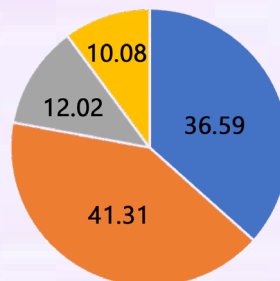
